



# **Congratulations !!!**

You are possibly a new FAA Certified Flight Instructor (CFI) or you maybe a veteran CFI with thousands of hours of flight time and hundreds of stories to tell, or maybe somewhere in between. No matter where you are on this CFI "experience spectrum" there are many valued traits or characteristics of a good flight instructor that can be shared - in this article I'd like to introduce, address or emphasize just three (3). Search the web for qualities of a "good or great instructor" and you'll find an incredible amout of information. Narrow your search on being a good or great "flight" instructor and the amount of information shrinks but remains large. Please continue to expand your instructor knowledge.

Before discussing just three (3) traits or characteristics of a good flight instructor, I'd like to take the opportunity to say "CONGRATULATIONS" to you on obtaining (and retaining) your CFI certificate. The FAA CFI certificate is the result of a lot of study, dedication, hard work and investment in both time and money. The initial CFI pass rate has increased over the past several years (reference the below chart) and dispels the "myth" that the CFI checkride has only a 50% initial pass rate. NOTE: the Private Pilot and Commercial Pilot initial pass rates have also increased over the past several years.

The FAA publishes a wealth of aviation information for both students and instructors which is available in both print and online via their website: <a href="www.faa.gov">www.faa.gov</a> Other sources (GLEIM, Jeppesen, ASA, etc) also publish a vast amount of aviation information available for a course of study and for reference. The one source we all studied, either recently or years ago, is the Aviation Instructor's Handbook (AIH)

FAA — H-8083-9. This FAA handbook is an outstanding resource for ANY instructor and specifically aviation instructor's in both flight and ground roles. So, let's look at and emphasize just a couple of qualities of being a great flight instructor.

- BE a prepared flight instructor— the importance of preparation in flight instruction cannot be over emphasized. Work to lead productive, engaging lessons for your students and maximize the effectiveness of your time and resources. Preparation is an essential element of learning.
- 2. ALLOW your student to make mistakes in flight instruction this can be a challenge. A student learning from their mistakes is an important part of their training but, as an instructor you need to know the limits of both you and your student. Keep it safe, DO NOT ignore or neglect safety!!
- 3. KEEP your students informed students feel insecure when they do not know what is expected of them. As an instructor you can keep students informed in various ways give them an overview of the lesson/course, keep them posted on their progress, feedback is essential, and give them adequate notice of requirements (i.e., assignments, examinations, phase checks, checkrides).



I challenge you to go and review the AIH (FAA-H-8083-9) specifically Chapter 8, Aviation Instructor Responsibilities and Professionalism. Previous chapters in the AIH discussed how people learn, the teaching process and teaching methods along with other valuable instructional information. Chapter 8 is dedicated to "Responsibilities and Professionalism" and includes the below lists of valuable information to help you become a better flight instructor:

- Responsibilities of ALL Aviation Instructors
- Minimizing Learner Frustration
- Additional Responsibilities of Flight Instructors
- Teaching Tips from Veteran Flight Instructors
- ➤ Instructor Do's and Instructor Don'ts
