THE DEMAND FOR AVIATION TECHNICIANS IS HIGHER THAN EVER

The demand for qualified aviation professionals continues to grow at an ever increasing rate. Employers are knocking on doors of colleges and trade schools at an alarming rate but many times, the candidates aren't there.

The average age of the current group of Airframe and Power Plant Technicians continue to grow. Nearly 20% of the work force is over age 60. Approxomately 30% are within 10 years of retirement. Annually, only about 2% of the workforce are being replaced each year by program graduates. Studies show that approxiimately 20% of program graduates accept employment in other areas of employment than aviation. Only about 60% of the students who finish programs are completing the required orals and practicals that qualify them for aviation technician positions.

Avioncs Technicians are even more scarce. They are in high demand today. The technologically advanced modern aircraft of today have more wires connected to components than ever before. Avionics technicians are critical to the safe operation of the aircraft. The need for adding and upgrading avionics systems is continuous yet young people are not flocking to these highly lucarative in demand areas of employment. What is the problem? Studies show that lack of awareness is the largest problem. The time is right to enter this ever expanding career path!!!

Aviation Career Paths Expanding in High Schools and Colleges Throughout the Area.

Lewis and Clark Community College – LCC Community college is currently under development of an Aviation Electronics (Avionics) program at their Godfrey facility. Their plan is to develop partnerships with area high schools.

Southwestern Illinois College - SWIC is continuing to expand their list of aviation programs. In January, starting with the Spring 2025 semester the new Aviation Electronics (Avionics) program is launching at the Granite City Industrial Technology Center Campus location. The program was developed with the guidance of Purdue University and the Aircraft Electronics Association (AEA). Purdue is one of the highest rated aviation program in the country. SWIC has provided Aviation programs since 1968 that are currently expanding to add additional services in aviation education.

Belleville Township High School - (BTHS) -Center for Advanced Vocational Education C.A.V.E.. BTHS East and West has approximately 4,500 enrolled students. The C.A.V.E. facility has partnered with Gulfstream Aerospace that supports aviation training programs developing students skills to help gain employment opportunities after their high school graduation.

Southern Illinois University Carbondale – The SIU Carbondale Extended Campus program added a B.S. Degree Program in Aviation Management on the Belleville Southwestern Illinois College (SWIC) Campus on a every other weekend format. Students can transfer and / or obtain credit for prior military, flight training, aviation maintenance and industry training. The core 48 semester hour program completes in only 16 months. The Extended Campus program is only about 40% of the cost of completing the program on the SIU Carbondale based campus.

Cold Weather Flight Operations

Cold and freezing temperatures are back. It's time to practice extra safety precautions during this time of the year and also to become your aircraft's best friend to guard against excessive engine wear and to further enhance safe operations.

Here's the the best time to find Preflight problems, not after takeoff when choices become more limited. If the aircraft does not have the benefit of a hangar, proper preflight and extra precautions can become critical. Conduct a through check for any frozen contamination on the fuselage, both surface and hidden areas. Frozen liquids inside of flight controls can cause an out of balance situation that can cause flutter or even restrict movement. A small amount of water in a fuel system, if settled in the wrong, place can restrict or even totally stop/restrict the flow of fuel at low or high power settings.



Initial Engine Start and Warm Up - Follow preheating recommendations by engine manufacturer. Inital engine start and warm up is critical to wear and engine life. The first few minutes of engine run time can generate more wear than the next several hours of normal engine operation. Inital start lubrication and internal engine component expansion needs to be closely managed.

The proper grade of oil for winter opertion is also essential, be sure that this is addressed before first severe cold temperature flight, NOT after !!
