### " Avoid This Simple Mistake"

A few weeks ago a friend of mine who was just finishing his PPL ASEL met the DPE for the check ride on an ideal Spring morning and, unfortunately, never even got past the ID check (usually the first thing a DPE looks at). Before a DPE administers a check ride they must make sure that the applicant is who they say they are - pretty simple, huh! Well, in this instance the recommending CFI (who happened to be sitting in on the check) hadn't confirmed that the applicant's name on his Student Pilot certificate and the applicant's Driver's License were the same. Seems like something that one wouldn't even think about, but in this case the names were slightly different, so the DPE had no choice other than to NOT even begin the check ride. The student had to go to the local FSDO and clear up the confusion, but, in the meantime had to reschedule the check - ride which he couldn't easily do as the DPE as booked weeks in advance.

### "AVOID THIS SIMPLE MISTAKE" Cont.

This caused more training so that the applicant maintained the proficiency needed to feel good about taking the check, and at \$315/hour for the airplane & CFI, this was an expensive issue! So, it might be a good idea to confirm the names match when our student gets their initial Student Pilot certificate to avoid this simple mistake.

## GSLFIA "WHO WE ARE, WHAT WE DO, WHAT DO WE HAVE TO OFFER"

Our mission statement "The Greater St. Louis Flight Instructors Association promotes aviation safety and improvement of flight instruction by increasing education, instructor knowledge, professionalism and techniques", is the starting point for who we are, what we do and what we have to offer. To continue with our website "This is accomplished through the exchange of ideas and techniques between instructors, developing effective communications, and/or liaison with the FAA and/or other desirable aviation interested entities. We deliver ideas and techniques by sponsoring the Ed Blue Flight Instructor Scholarship, FAA Safety Clinics, FAA Wings Programs, and FAA approved Flight Instructors Revalidation Clinic and other Seminars".

There are very few Flight Instructor associations in the US with National Association of Flight Instructors (NAFI), Society of Aviation and Flight Educators (SAFE) and the GSLFIA being the only ones that I know of. So we are a rather unique organization and have been around since the late 1960's with about 100 CFI members, mostly in the St. Louis, Missouri area.

GSLFIA has been putting on Flight Instructor Refresher Clinics since the early 1970's, renewing thousands of CFIs over the last half century. We continue to offer an annual in person FIRC each January, where attendees can discuss issues with other, very experienced CFIs. A typical FIRC will have CFIs with a cumulative experience of 40,000 - 50,000 hours of "dual given".

The GSLFIA sponsors about 6-10 presentations every year to the St. Louis area's General Aviation community. Topics from CFI techniques, regulatory/AIM changes, specific topics on aircraft care, icing, Loss of Control, discussions with local DPEs on what they see on check rides and how to better prepare our students to be successful on a check ride, We sponsor annual tours of the STL TRACON to give pilots a chance to discuss issues with ATC controllers in order to understand each others' duties and requirements, thus making a much safer environment.

We sponsor "CFI of the Year", "New CFI of the Year", Discovery Flights for potential pilots, an "Ed Blue Scholarship" for outstanding CFIs, a "James Byrnes" award for individuals who've greatly contributed to STL area aviation over a long period of time, the "Spirit of St. Louis" award for individuals or corporations who've been instrumental in promoting St. Louis aviation. These awards are traditionally presented in our Awards banquet held at a St. Louis location.

GSLFIA maintains a list of CFIs available to provide almost any kind of flight instruction imaginable to prospective pilots from all of the local STL are airports. Some of our CFIs provide remedial training to those who may need a little extra attention in certain areas.

We enjoy a close relationship with the many aviation businesses and educational institutions in and around St. Louis, such as; Southwestern Illinois College (SWIC), St. Louis University, all of the local flight schools, the various MRO facilities in the area and pilot organizations such as Experimental Aviation Association (EAA), Greater St. Louis Business Aircraft Association (GSLBAA), Women in Aviation International (WAI), etc.
