Global Aerospace Summit A Major Aviation Related Event with a Serious Plan for the Future.

Just weeks ago on August 13th and 14th the Global Aviation Summit sponsored by the Southwestern Illinois Leadership Council filled the entire banquet hall of the Regency Conference Center at 400 Regency Park in O'Fallon Illinois.



This event was the first of a series of planned aviation promotional events that focused on employers, educators, STEM Programs, manufacturers, Internships and more to address the need for candidates with needed aviation skills.

Major Industry giants from the U.S. and beyond, Boeing, Gulfstream, West Star and several others were present along with about 260 plus others who are becoming part of a plan to determine how are we going to meet the needs of a rapidly growing industry in this area. The Southwestern Illinois Leadership Council staff had done their homework and invited representatives that brought in many of the colleges, trade schools, industrial training, STEM organizations and many additional training programs in the area. Kyle Anderson the President of the Southwestern Illinois Leadersthip Council and Bi-State Development Agency Vice President Mary Lamie of the Take Flight Forum guided the event to a new awareness of the need for qualified talent.

One of the highly valued items regarding this area are the large number of STEM programs and organizations that promote aviation knowledge and skills that are introduced at an early age. Several of the STEM and high school programs are now offering, Aircraft Upholstery, Aviation Electronics, Cabinetry, (Basics) A&P Airframe and Power Plant.

"Beyond The ACS"

Remember, a long time ago, when you were young and thought that you knew everything, and there was nothing else that you needed to learn? On February 28, 1971, when I was a 17 year old high school junior, DPE Ron Eads, from Belleville Area College, handed me my Private Pilot Certificate and I thought, now I know everything there is to know about flying - I have a certificate, don't I?

Fast forward almost 55 years and I realize that I was then and still am a STUDENT pilot (and that's a good thing!). When I'm asked how long it takes to learn to fly, I tell people "a lifetime, of course". You might get all of the certificates and ratings and satisfy all the tasks in the numerous Airman Certification Standards (ACS) but that is just the minimum. When you got your Commercial MEL would you hop in the right seat of a Boeing or Gulfstream and start carrying passengers for hire? When you got your Instrument rating, would you shoot that ILS to 200 and a 1/2 the next day? Maybe you could, but now I know better. After almost 55 years and 34,000 hours of flying, I've realized that there is so much that I still don't know (and probably never will).



I've learned that every day that I fly, no matter what type of aircraft, I should be learning something - often that is not in an ACS.

I find that when I listen to very experienced pilots like, Greg P., Peter S., John M., I hang on every word - they are my Mentors and have done so much more that I probably ever will. So, how do I get to the frame of mind that there's more that I need to learn? For one thing, maybe read this article and for another, attend an upcoming presentation about just this very idea - "Beyond the ACS". I still need to confirm the date/venue but watch for a SPANS (Thank you Randy), and/or posters, websites (I Fly STL, etc.) and please join me in discussing how to continue your lifetime of learning to fly. Bring your own ideas, you'll see how many of us have things that we don't know about and could learn, that might not even be in the ACS! Thank you and I hope to see you in a few weeks.
